Ora Ada Osborn, 102, passed away Friday, September 17, 2004 in Broken Arrow Oklahoma. Mrs. Osborn was born in Okay, Arkansas January 16, 1902 to L. P. Hatley and Evelyn Barton. Mrs. Osborn was a member of Eastside Christian Church; a member of Friendship Craft Club for over 50 years; past president of the VFW Woman's Auxiliary; she was a talented artist, enjoyed making ceramics, doing embroidery and quilting.
